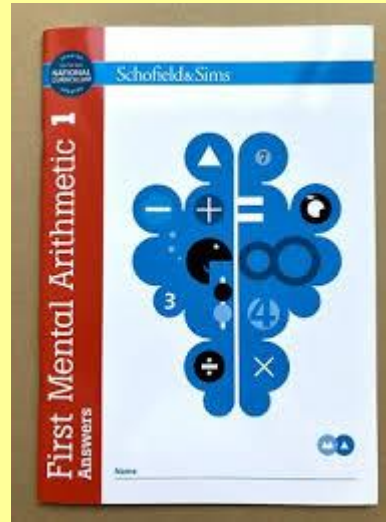

Victorian schools were very different to schools today.

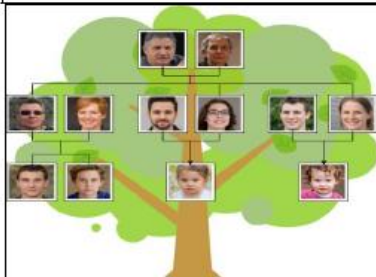
They had:

Family Tree

A family tree is a diagram that shows someone's family. The oldest family members are at the top of the tree and the youngest are at the bottom. Every family tree looks different because no two families are the same.



Artefacts

An artefact is an object from the past. Museums often display historical artefacts. Artefacts can tell us about how people used to live. Everyday objects like clothing, toys and books can tell us about childhood in the past.

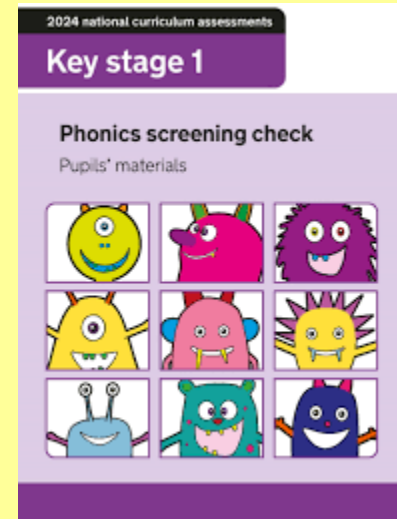

Reading

- ✓ Daily phonics lessons
- ✓ Quality texts in English lessons
- ✓ Weekly Reading lesson focusing on the VIPERS (Vocabulary, Inference, Predictions, Explanation, Retrieve, Summarise)
- ✓ Whole class novel

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

- ✓ The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a national assessment administered to all Year 1 pupils in June to check their phonic decoding skills.
- ✓ It consists of a reading assessment of 40 words, a mix of real words and made-up "alien" words.
- ✓ Children who do not pass in Year 1 receive further support and get a chance to retake the check in Year 2.

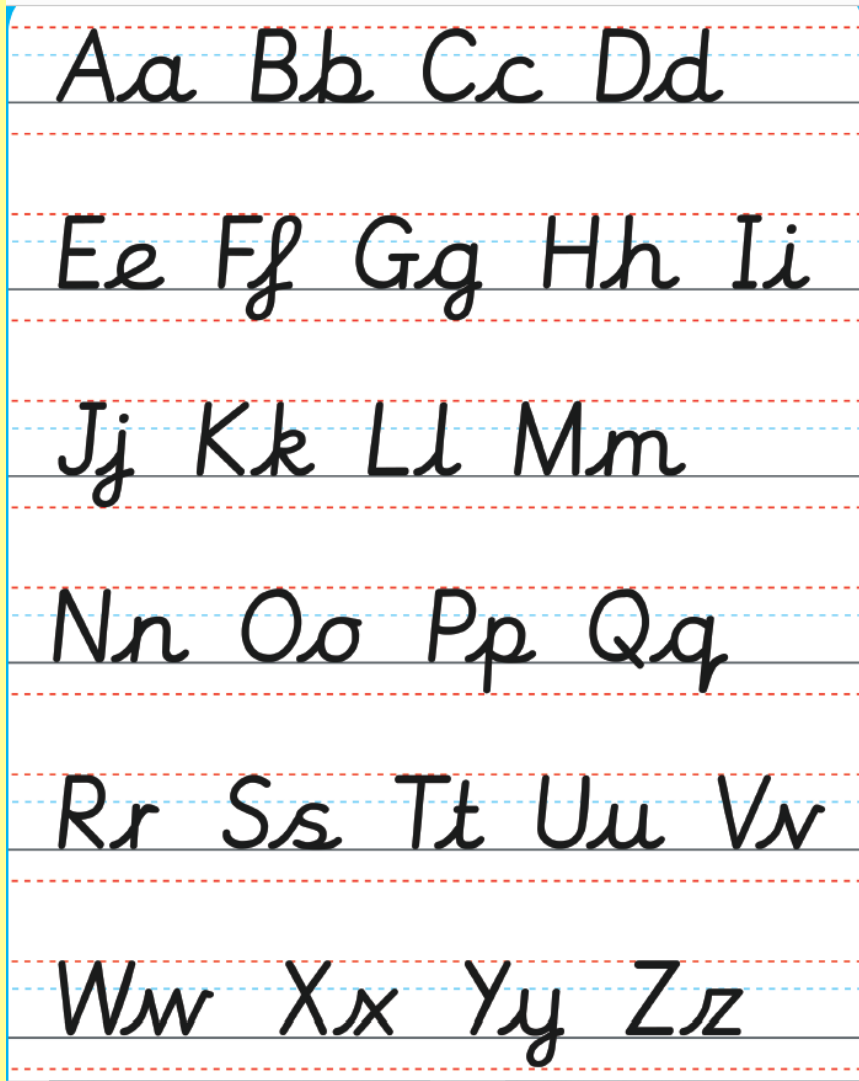


Purpose:

- ✓ The main goal is to confirm that children have learned phonic decoding to a standard appropriate for their age.
- ✓ To help teachers identify pupils who need extra help with their reading skills, allowing them to receive prompt support.

Writing

- ✓ Writing is taught in English lessons throughout the week
- ✓ Writing skills are however applied across all areas of the curriculum
- ✓ Writing is based upon our class topic
- ✓ Writing is taught through quality texts
- ✓ Daily handwriting practice (cursive)



Handwriting

- ✓ In Year 1 children are taught cursive handwriting. This gets them ready to join up their writing.

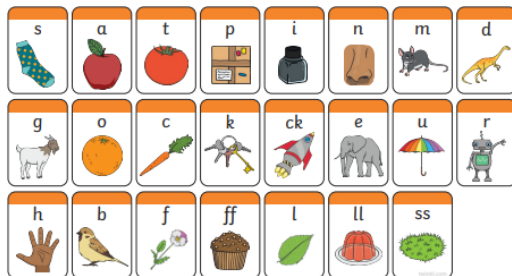
