

A Victorian School


Victorian schools were very different to schools today. They had:




Artefacts

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check



- ✓ The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check is a national assessment
 - administered to all Year 1 pupils in June to check their phonic decoding skills.
- ✓ It consists of a reading assessment of 40 words, a mix of real words and made-up "alien" words.
- ✓ Children who do not pass in Year 1 receive further support and get a chance to retake the check in Year 2.

2024 national curriculum assessments Key stage 1 Phonics screening check Pupils' materials

Purpose:

- The main goal is to confirm that children have learned phonic decoding to a standard appropriate for their age.
- ✓ To help teachers identify pupils who need extra help with their reading skills, allowing them to receive prompt support.



Writing

- ✓ Writing is taught in English lessons throughout the week
- ✓ Writing skills are however applied across all areas of the curriculum
- ✓ Writing is based upon our class topic
- ✓ Writing is taught through quality texts
- ✓ Daily handwriting practice (cursive)




