Create a comic-strip

Create a comic-strip for an Anglo-Saxon raid on a village.

Draw or Research an Anglo-Saxon Village

Create a picture of a village showing houses, farms, and people. You could also label what each part was used for.



Light and Shadow experiment



Vikings used sun shadow boards to find their way when travelling. These devices were abit like a sundial: they used shadow to find the direction they were travelling in, but they only worked on sunny days.

Carry out your own scientific investigation

Which materials cast good shadows? Can we use shadows for things other than telling time or direction?

Write a Short Diary Entry

Imagine you are a Viking child or an Anglo-Saxon child. Write a short diary entry about a day in your life (what do you see, wear, or eat?).

Create a map

Create a map showing where the Vikings and Anglo-Saxons came from and where they settled in Britain. You may like to add arrows to show their journeys across the sea.

Design a Viking Shield

Create your own shield pattern on paper or card. Think about colours, shapes, and symbols Vikings used for protection and identity.
