Inclusion and Diversity

Our PSHE curriculum is supported through the [Twinkl Life PSHE Scheme](#), which places inclusion, diversity, equality and respect at the centre of learning. The scheme is fully aligned with statutory Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSHE) guidance and supports children in becoming respectful, responsible and active members of society.

Through our PSHE curriculum, we aim to ensure that all pupils feel represented, valued and included. We promote an environment where differences are celebrated and where children are encouraged to develop empathy, understanding and respect for others.

Our approach to inclusion and diversity includes:

- Promoting respect for all people regardless of race, religion, culture, gender, disability, age or family background.
- Teaching children about different families, relationships, cultures and communities in a sensitive and age-appropriate way.
- Encouraging pupils to celebrate diversity and recognise the positive contribution that different people and communities make to society.
- Supporting children to understand equality, fairness and the importance of challenging stereotypes and discrimination.
- Developing pupils' understanding of British Values, including mutual respect and tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.
- Providing opportunities for pupils to discuss important social issues in a safe, supportive and respectful environment.
- Promoting positive mental health, emotional wellbeing and a strong sense of belonging within the school community.
- Helping children to build positive relationships, develop empathy and understand the importance of kindness and inclusion.
- Teaching pupils about online safety, respectful communication and responsible behaviour both online and offline.
- Ensuring that PSHE lessons are accessible to all pupils, including those with SEND and additional needs, through adapted teaching approaches and differentiated resources.
- Using inclusive language, resources and teaching materials that reflect the diversity of modern Britain.
- Encouraging children to develop confidence, resilience and self-esteem so that they feel safe to express themselves and respect the views of others.
- Supporting pupils to recognise and challenge bullying, prejudice and discriminatory behaviour.
- Creating opportunities for children to learn about global citizenship and their role within a diverse society.
