

Year 6 WWII Home Learning Challenges

HISTORY

Research one major event from World War II (e.g., D-Day, the Blitz, VE Day) and create a short timeline showing the main events.

OR

Find out about a famous person from WWII (e.g., Winston Churchill, Anne Frank, or a local hero) and write a short biography.

Pick and choose some tasks to complete at home and bring in to share with the class! These are not compulsory but optional extras for anyone who would like to complete some home learning based on our class topic.



GEOGRAPHY

Draw a map of Europe in 1939 and show which countries were in the Allies and Axis powers. Use colours or symbols to make it clear.

OR

Research and present a short fact sheet about how WWII affected life in Britain's cities and countryside.

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

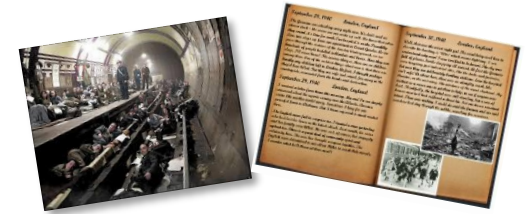
Make a simple model of an Anderson shelter or a Spitfire plane using cardboard, recycled materials, or LEGO.

OR

Create a small 'ration recipe' using wartime ingredients. Research what foods were rationed and try making a simple snack.

MATHS

Investigate some wartime statistics, like ration amounts, evacuation numbers, or army sizes. Make a bar chart, pie chart, or table to show your findings.



ENGLISH

Imagine you are a child living during the Blitz. Write a short diary entry describing one day and your feelings.



ART

Design a WWII propaganda poster encouraging people to support the war effort. Think about slogans, colours, and images.

MUSIC

Try learning a simple verse or melody from a wartime song and perform it to your family.

COMPUTING

Use PowerPoint, Google Slides, or another tool to make a short presentation about a WWII topic of your choice. Include images, dates, and captions.

OR

Create a simple online quiz (or paper version) for your family to test their WWII knowledge.
