

Year 6 Holes Home Learning Challenges

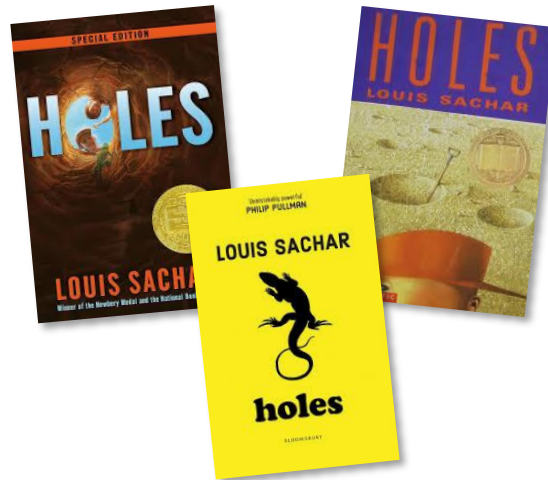


HISTORY
Find out about the history of juvenile detention camps in the USA. Create a short information page explaining what they were and why they existed.

OR

Research the history of cursed family legends (like the Yelnats family curse) and explore how stories and beliefs are passed

Pick and choose some tasks to complete at home and bring in to share with the class! These are not compulsory but optional extras for anyone who would like to complete some home learning based on our class topic.



DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

Build a model of Camp Green Lake using cardboard, clay, LEGO, or recycled materials. Include key features from the story.

OR

Design a survival pack for someone living at Camp Green Lake. What would they need and why?

ENGLISH

Write a diary entry as Stanley Yelnats on his first day at Camp Green Lake. Describe how he feels, what he sees, and what he thinks the camp will be like.

OR

Write a character description of Zero. Think about his personality, actions, and how he changes during the story.

GEOGRAPHY

Research deserts around the world. Create a fact file about the desert where Camp Green Lake is set, including climate, animals, and interesting features.

OR

Draw a map of Camp Green Lake and label important places such as the tents, Warden's cabin, and the digging sites.

MATHS

Calculate how much digging Stanley would do if he dug one hole per day for a month. Estimate the volume of a hole using measurements and present your working.



ART

Design a new book cover for Holes. Think carefully about symbols, colours, and key objects from the story.



MUSIC

Create a soundscape to represent Camp Green Lake. Think about wind, digging, heat, and tension. Perform it using objects or instruments.

COMPUTING

Create a PowerPoint or Google Slides presentation about Holes, including plot summary, characters, and themes.

OR

Design a quiz about the book for your classmates (multiple choice or true/false).
